In June 1913 nineteen women signed the charter of incorporation for BWC. Originally named Woman's Club of Bradentown, later changed in 1930 to Bradenton Woman's Club after Bradentown was changed to Bradenton. Just five years later in 1918, the women of BWC purchased two lots at the corner of Manatee Avenue and Virginia Drive for \$1,500. The membership voted to beginning building a clubhouse on the property that was secured in 1918. Completed in 1921, the Bradenton Woman's Club building is testament to the long history of Bradenton and still serves its original purpose of women working for the betterment of the community.

For a number of years after construction, the Bradenton Woman's Club was the only public facility in Bradenton large enough to accommodate the diverse needs of the community. It is the only Woman's Club in Florida to have a mezzanine with an open two-story meeting space.

The clubhouse is a Colonial Revival-style building designed by architect Fred W. Kermode. The Colonial Revival design is distinctive for its period of construction during the Florida Land Boom, when Mediterranean Revival architecture was at its most popular in the state of Florida.

March 2019, the Bradenton Woman's Club clubhouse was designated on the National Park Service's National Register of Historic Places.









SEPTEMBER 2023

All wall scones & chandeliers have been installed. There were some delays and additional expense due to the original knob and tube wiring having to be replaced.

The wiring has not been replaced in the fireplace room, but the fans and chandeliers have been hung.

The exterior motion sensor light has been installed at the front door ramp.

The roof on the north side of the building has been installed.

The ceiling has been patched and just awaiting painting.

The pantry has had new lights and ceiling fans installed.

The pantry has been reorganized and all event items & tablecloths are now located there.

Upstairs has been cleaned and the hope is to install and decorate with period furniture.

New stage curtains that match the BWC header have been ordered and paid for by a donation.
